### Recreation Fire rules:

- Fires will be no bigger than 3 foot in diameter and 2 feet high.
- Fires and hot coals in fire pits will be attended at all times by the owner or the owner's agents.
- Fires will be completely extinguished with water when no longer in use. (Ashes will be cold to the touch).
- At no time will fire be allowed out of the designated fire pit by sticks or other means.
- This approval is only valid during an allowable fire season. State, County, and Local fire restrictions supersede this approval document. Fires are only allowed during an open fire period.
- This document does not release the property owner, guests or owner's agents from liability of the use or misuse of the approved fire pit.
- Fires that become out-of-control as a result of this fire pit are the owners and/or owners agents' responsibility and liability.
- The Fire Chief or Local Fire District is not responsible or liable for a fire that is a result of this fire pit.
- Good judgment should be used when having a fire. Some weather conditions such as wind should determine the cancellation of the use of a fire pit.
- Gasoline or other highly flammable liquids are not to be used to start fires.
- Only natural wood is to be burned in a private fire pit.
- Check local conditions and current orders before lighting a fire in this fire pit.
